

Coastal Landscape photography workshops FAQ

What are they?

These are tutor-led classes in landscape photography; specifically coastal landscapes and locations in Norfolk, organised for small groups of 2 - 4 photographer students of any age or ability. They are highly practical and hands-on and immense fun too, so no stuffy classroom here. Just the Great Outdoors, lots of fresh air, and Norfolk's stunningly varied coastline as your subject.

I'll provide you with plenty of advice and guidance without bludgeoning you over the head with it (honest). As an experienced tutor I know when to step in, but I also know when to step back. I'll also know before we set out what your level of experience is so that any tuition will be relevant and appropriate to your needs. Rest assured, I'm a photographer who's spent over 25 years as a professional freelance photographer and tutor, and I'm passionate about the Norfolk Coast.

When are they?

These workshops take place throughout the year, but mainly in the warmer months of the year, although Winter itself can provide some of the most dramatic skies and seas imaginable.

To a large extent, they are driven by demand, so if you have a particular week or weekend date in mind, get in touch to discuss your requirements. These courses are flexible and based around your requirements so provided that the time and location are suitable, the workshop will run even if you are the only participant. In most cases however, students benefit greatly from the companionship and sense of achievement gained from working within a small group.

Where are they held?

I've identified a variety of different landscapes which range from picturesque Brancaster, Holkham, Wells and Blakeney, to windswept Horsey, Waxham & Winterton, to the seaside towns of Cromer, Sheringham and Gorleston. All have their own unique Norfolk "flavour" and all provide excellent photographic opportunities.

But if you have a favourite location, make it known to me. This is your workshop after all.

How long is each workshop?

Usually a day. But if you feel you'd benefit from an extra days digital editing tuition back at my base in Norwich, this can easily be arranged. Remember, these courses are all about how YOU can improve YOUR PHOTOGRAPHY, so although the majority of landscape courses are 1 day, additional days can be added at a reduced rate provided advance notice is given.

What do I need to bring?

Your own camera (film OR digital), tripod if you have one, suitable outdoor weatherproof clothing and footwear for the conditions and time of year, and an enquiring mind.

You may also need to consider memory cards, batteries, and strong, protective camera holdall or rucksack. Packed lunch and water is also usually required.

What else do I need to know?

Start times, any health and fitness worries, transport issues, and accommodation can all be discussed with me in advance, or dealt with via the online registration and booking form.

I have full public liability insurance and full up-to-date CRB check.

When visiting certain locations on the Norfolk Coast, all workshop students, where appropriate, will be expected to adhere to the guidelines and code of practice set out in the Norfolk Coast Field Studies code of practice published by the Norfolk Coast Partnership:
